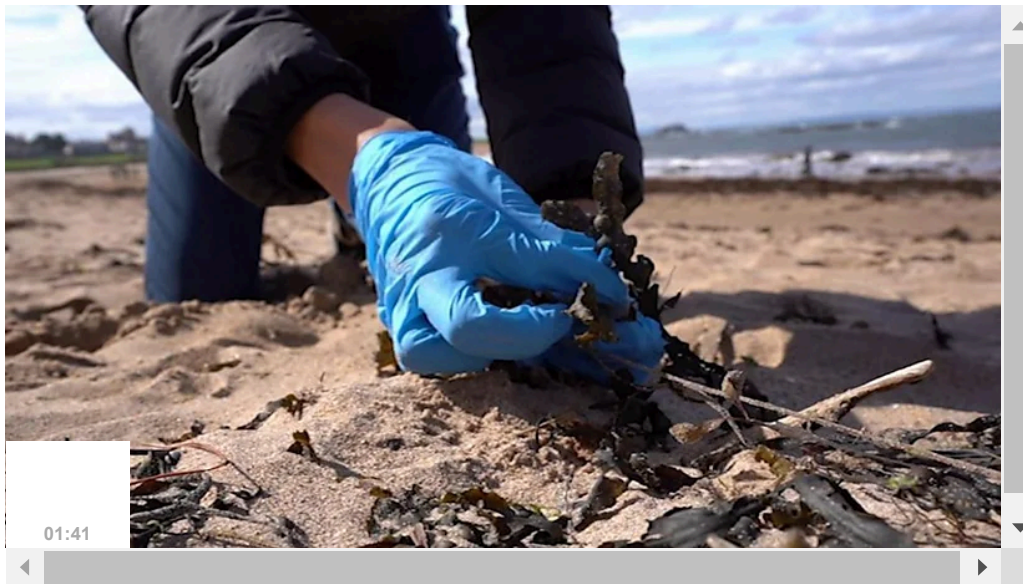
Write a sentence about a piece of plastic rubbish on a beach that includes personification.
